

2010 Legislative Session – Enrolled Bills Relating to Tobacco

HB 5001 – Relating to Appropriations

SPECIAL CATEGORIES

COMPREHENSIVE STATEWIDE TOBACCO PREVENTION
AND EDUCATION PROGRAM

FROM TOBACCO SETTLEMENT TRUST FUND 61,293,054

Funds in Specific Appropriation 568 shall be used to implement the Comprehensive Statewide Tobacco Education and Prevention Program in accordance with Section 27, Article X of the State Constitution as adjusted annually for inflation, using the Consumer Price Index as published by the United States Department of Labor. The appropriation shall be allocated as follows:

State & Community Interventions.....	10,860,519
State & Community Interventions - AHEC.....	6,000,000
Health Communications Interventions.....	20,532,122
Cessation Interventions.....	11,768,879
Cessation Interventions - AHEC.....	4,000,000
Surveillance & Evaluation.....	5,355,029
Administration & Management.....	2,776,505

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 568, the department may use nicotine replacements and other treatments approved by the Federal Food and Drug Administration as part of smoking cessation interventions.

HB 5309 - Relating to Comprehensive Statewide Tobacco Education and Use Prevention Program

- The department shall award a contract or grant in the amount of \$10 million to the AHEC network for the purpose of developing the components described in paragraph (3)(i) (tobacco-use cessation). The AHEC network may apply for competitive contracts or grants. Allows for annual AHEC funding if the money is appropriated.
- The enrolled bill does not include language regarding smokers with mental illness. Also removes requirement to fund \$9 million in cessation services for this population.

SB 0366 – Relating to Retail Sales of Smoking Pipes and Devices

HB 5311 – Relating to the Department of Health

- Beginning in the 2010-2011 fiscal year and thereafter, \$50 million from 5 percent of the revenue deposited into the Health Care Trust Fund pursuant to ss. 210.011(9) and 210.276(7) shall be reserved for research of tobacco-related or cancer-related illnesses.
- Of the revenue deposited in the Health Care Trust Fund pursuant to this section, \$50 million shall be transferred to the Biomedical Research Trust Fund within the Department of Health. Subject to annual appropriations in the General Appropriations Act, \$20 million shall be appropriated to the James and Esther King Biomedical Research Program, \$20 million shall be appropriated to the William G. "Bill" Bankhead, Jr., and David Coley Cancer Research Program created under s. 381.922, and \$10 million shall be appropriated to the H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center and Research Institute established under s. 1004.43.
